Building progress

The building is now growing fast! There was a small delay after Christmas because of bad weather and a delayed steel delivery. However the builders are now catching up; the concrete for the ground floor is being poured this week and the first floor will be delivered next week.



We are still on schedule to start putting up the boat-racks and start moving back in at the beginning of April. You can follow progress on the Club website: the latest pictures are on the home page, towards the bottom left-hand corner.

Meanwhile the temporary tent arrangements have served us well, and we have been meeting regularly in the 'Valley' bar.

Stream conditions

The river has continued to run quite fast throughout January, and for one or two weeks we could not boat because the landing-stage was too icy. As the flow has

dropped, we have been able to boat eights and quads with reasonably experienced crews, and hope that conditions will return to normal during February.

The Environment Agency will be closing the towpath between Felix Road and the Anglers for most of March and into April, to rebuild the bank. Coaches and others will have to make a long detour; the quickest way by bike or on foot is up Felix Road, through the recreation ground and Dudley Road, along Terrace Road for a short way and then through the small park to Manor Road.

Hampton Head

Sam Knight and Angus Groom won the junior doubles title in impressive style, and then teamed up in a composite to come second in the quads.

Our next best result came from the youngest girls group who came second in WJ13 quads, less than a second behind the winners. The older girls also did exceptionally well, with Holly Jones, Sam Ball, Hannah Traylen and Julia Clarke coming second in girls fours, and then teaming up with Sophie Walker, Naomi Allberry, Alice Correia-Morton, Annie Withers and Joanna Fish to come 5th in the eights.

Our younger boys matched the girls with second place in J13 quads, and 8th in J14 octuples against a very strong field containing most of the top rowing schools.

Forthcoming events

We will have two crews at the Molesey Veterans Head on 20th February. We then look forward to Burway Head, where we usually send a large contingent.

The Hyne Cup race (the annual match between Walton and Weybridge Rowing Clubs) will provisionally be held

on Sunday 21st February. This is a great event which allows us to enter some interesting combinations, so if you want to race that day, make sure your coach or Neil West knows in good time.

Walton Spring Head

Following the cancellation (yet again) of the Walton Small Boats Head in December, the committee has decided to run a smaller event, but including fours and quads as well as doubles, pairs and singles, on Saturday 10th April.

As for the Small Boats Head, we will need a team of at least sixty people to run this event, which we hope will be a great way to showcase our new boathouse (even if we won't actually be in full occupation by then).

Turkey Triathlon

The Turkey (or Christmas Pudding) Triathlon took place on Monday 28th December. Fourteen "crews" (singles or doubles) took part and the overall winner (by 13 seconds after an hour and a half) was Paul Hone. Paul last

The team has been invited to attend the finals of the senior trials at Dorney on 14th February, where the award will be made.

Ken Roberts will be running a British Rowing Level 2 coaching course in August; he is offering a subsidised place on the course for a suitably-qualified applicant from the Club.
